First, if you aren't already a member of *QCWA, Inc.*, become one. An application for membership in QCWA can be downloaded from its web site <http://www.qcwa.org>. In the confirmation of membership you will receive, you will be assigned a unique QCWA membership number. If you do nothing further, you are said to hold an "at-large membership."

Second, fill out and submit an application for chapter membership, along with at least one year's dues, to the chapter's Treasurer.
